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History

Regis is a tuition-free, Catholic, Jesuit high school located in Manhattan. The school opened in 1914 thanks to the generous financial support of Julia Grant, the Foundress, and her family. The legacy of the founding family was to provide a Catholic education for boys who could not afford it. Today, Regis continues to flourish thanks to the generosity of its alumni and parents.

Jesuit Mission

Regis High School offers a rigorous liberal arts curriculum grounded in *cura personalis*, meaning care for and development of the whole person. Regis prepares young men to be open to growth, intellectually proficient, and committed to justice. Graduates of Regis aspire to finding God in all things through professional accomplishment, leadership, and service to others.

Highly Selective Admission

Applicants complete the High School Placement Test (HSPT) and must score in the top 10 percent of nationwide students to be competitive for admission. Additionally, students must be Catholic and demonstrate desire for Catholic education. Admission is based upon past performance, academic promise, personal qualities, community engagement, and the need for financial assistance. **The Class of 2025 had 633 applicants, 140 admitted students, and 136 matriculated students.**

Tuition-Free Education

Students pay no tuition to attend Regis High School due to its founding endowment in 1912 and the generous support of alumni, family, and friends. **Regis is the only tuition-free private school in the United States.** This ensures a student body of extraordinary talent and a wide range of socioeconomic backgrounds.

Curriculum and Grading

All students chosen for admission are intellectually gifted. Accordingly, all courses at Regis High School are taught at the honors or college level. **There is no weighting of courses, and class rank is not computed.** A distribution chart of cumulative unweighted grade point averages is provided on the second page of this profile.

Learning Outside of the Classroom

Regis provides numerous opportunities for students to extend their learning beyond the classroom, including 10 international experiences (cultural, language exchanges, service), independent scientific research, history symposiums, and a trimester of service-learning in senior year.

Geographic Distribution

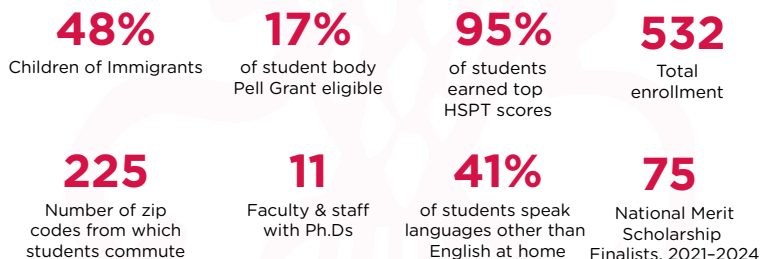


Regis attracts students from more zip codes than any private day school in the United States. With its location in the heart of Manhattan, the average commute time per student is more than one hour each way.

Overview of Student Body

Regis High School is routinely recognized as one of the nation's top 25 private high schools (SAT profile, National Merit Semifinalists, placement of students into the most selective universities). Students are selected solely based on their academic potential as well as a thoughtful interview process that assesses personal talents. As a tuition-free school, Regis has a unique and exceptional socioeconomic diversity. There is no other high school like Regis.

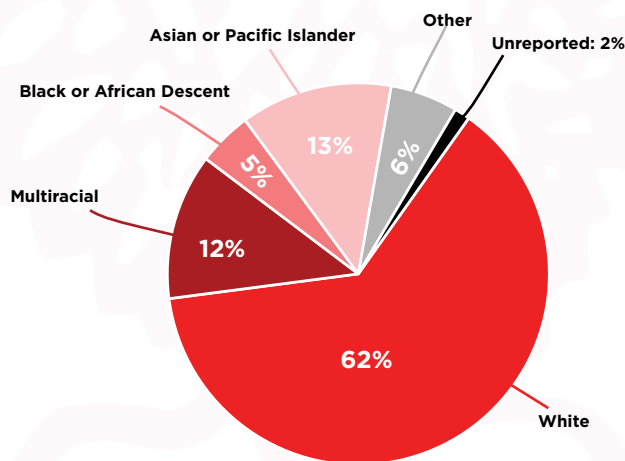
